

Shriners Establish Fund To Fight Tuberculosis

BUFFALO, N. Y.—Raymond E. Jackson, imperial potentate of the Ancient Egyptian Arabic Order Nobles of the Mystic Shrine, announced this week establishment of a \$50,000 National Foundation for fighting tuberculosis.

Jackson reported that the organization will have a three-fold program. It will include the providing of funds to train qualified medical personnel in treatment of the disease and education of the general public to the cause of the disease and care and treatment of patients.

Action on the proposed program to develop this foundation was approved recently in a meeting of the legal advisors headed by Atty. Levi H. Morris of Chicago.

Development of the project for raising funds to expand the service of the foundation was assigned to the organization's promotional department headed by William O. Greene, Detroit. Alton A. Davis, Chicago advertiser, has been added to this department.

A series of bathing beauty contests will be held in 150 temples areas and in as many cities, with local winners competing in a national contest at Atlantic City,

August 17, during the Shriners convention.

The first program of which proceeds will be donated to the foundation will be held in Washington, D. C., June 9 when Duke Ellington will render a concert at Winter Gate.
