

Shriners Give 20Gs To Fight TB, Cancer

BOSTON—During its convention here the board of directors of the Shriners' Tuberculosis and Cancer Research foundation, Inc., presented a check for \$20,000 as an initial grant to the Freedman's Hospital, Washington, D. C., to establish there a search clinic to eradicate those two dangerous diseases—tuberculosis and cancer.
