### UNDERGROUND RAILROAD.

The *Priceton Post*, of Thursday gives the following account of the arrival at that place, of the train on this road whose expected coming we announced a few days ago:

A week ago last Saturday, our ears were greeted with the sound of the Underground Railroad whistle. This whistle has a peculiarity not possessed by those used on other Railroads; that is, of notifying those interested, of its approach, without disturbing the neighborhood, which we consider a great improvement on those in common use. Notwithstanding the road has been so long idle, the officers and attendants were found at their posts and the cars were switched off to their several depots without accident.

Next day being Sunday, and no train running on that day, the passengers, eleven in number, were detained until the Monday train, during which time they were well provided for at the several houses of entertainment attached to the line.
