

Henry D. Lloyd Accepts.

There was rejoicing at the headquarters of the People's party yesterday over the receipt of a letter from Henry D. Lloyd saying he would return home next week and accept the nomination of that party for Congress in the Seventh District. Immediately Campaign Manager Copeland had Mr. Lloyd and Clarence S. Darrow booked to address a mass-meeting at Central Music Hall Saturday night, Oct. 6.
