

BACK IN LINE AGAIN.

Illinois Sweeps Into the Republican Column.

FIFTY THOUSAND GOOD.

These Are the Figures Outside of Cook County.

TWENTY THOUSAND HERE.

Sixteen Republican Congressmen Elected Beyond All Doubt.

LEGISLATURE NOW REPUBLICAN.

Illinois is back in the Republican column again with such a majority as she never gave before. The fondest expectations of the Republicans were mild in comparison with the results achieved. The Republicans will come up to Cook County with a majority of 50,000 at least. They will have eighty-five members of the House and twenty-nine members of the Senate, thus insuring beyond cavil or question the organization of both branches of the Legislature and the election of a Republican to the United States Senate. The returns from the Congressional districts show that the Republicans have achieved some wonderful gains. Maj. Connolly has carried Sangamon County by about 800 majority over Springer. Sangamon two years ago gave 1,856 Democratic. Springer is probably beaten and Graff, Rep., is elected in the Peoria district. The returns indicate that Walter Reeves, Rep., is elected to Congress from the La Salle County district, which was regarded as safely Democratic by 2,000 majority. Republican gains of 1,000 are recorded in Bureau and Sangamon Counties, 700 in La Salle, 2,200 in Will, 700 in Livingston, 500 in Morgan, 500 in Ogle, and so on throughout the State. The changes are greatest, of course, in the industrial centers, but the Democrats have lost heavily in the little counties in Central and Southern Illinois, where their majorities are sure but small. As an evidence of this fact Calhoun County, without a railroad or telegraph line, went Democratic two years ago by 277. A loss of 100 votes is recorded. Not a single county so far has shown a Democratic gain. A great many counties for the first time in their histories will elect Republicans to county offices. Col. Marsh has a fighting chance of beating his opponent, Truman Plantz, in the Quincy district. If the proportion of gains is kept up Murphy, R., will beat Higgins, D., in the old Foreman district, and Burrell, R., will beat Williams, D., in a district that is Democratic by 2,200.
