



Another Newcomer Victim

Attorney C. H. Taverlner succeeded in having Judge George Kersten of the Criminal Court give Dennison Reddick, 2976 Dearborn street, his freedom after he had presented a writ of habeas corpus and had shown that the evidence was insufficient on which Judge Newcomer of the Harrison street court had sentenced Reddick to the House of Correction for one year.

Saves Man From Penitentiary

The case of John Saunders, 25 years old, 3152 Wabash avenue, who was arrested by Detective Sergeants Middleton, Scott, Stark, Smith and Glenn of the detective bureau and found guilty by a jury in Judge Kavanagh's court for holding up with a gun James Cushinlere, a photographer at 2933 South State street, which carries a sentence of from one year to life, was reopened by Saunders' attorney, E. M. Seymour, before Judge Anton T. Zeman of the Criminal Court. The sentence was set aside and Saunders was given ninety days in jail.

Alice Williams Given Freedom

The information being insufficient, Attorney F. S. Delaney found the flaw, and Alice Williams, 12 East 35th street, was discharged by Judge Oscar Hebel of the Criminal Court on a writ of habeas corpus. She had been sentenced by Judge Howard Hayes of the Harrison street court to the House of Correction for thirty days and fined \$25 and costs on complaint of Herbert Stucker (white), 1529 East 60th street, who testified that the woman had taken \$9 from him.

Placed on Probation

Judge Joseph Sabath of the Criminal Court placed Mrs. Birdie Murphy, 27 years old, 3249 Indiana avenue, formerly of Little Rock, Ark., on probation for one year with the stipulation that she pay Mrs. Martha Sterling, 3348 State street, flat 306, the sum of \$200 for doctor's bill. The testimony

showed that the two women had worked in Fred Harvey's restaurant and on Dec. 4 last had engaged in an argument, during which Mrs. Sterling was assaulted by Mrs. Murphy with a knife. Assistant State's Attorney Beckwith was assisted in the prosecution by Attorney W. E. King, while the defense was capably handled by J. F. Wilson and W. E. Mollison.

Released From Bridewell

Attorney W. J. Latham appeared before Judge Joseph Sabath of the Criminal Court with a writ of habeas corpus in behalf of William Tison, who had been sentenced to three months in the House of Correction and fined \$100 by Judge Newcomer of the Harrison street court Aug. 1. Judge Sabath ordered the prisoner's discharge when Attorney Latham showed that the prisoner had only a pocketknife in his possession at the time of his arrest, but he had been sentenced for having a gun.

Must Make Restitution

Judge Anton T. Zeman of the Criminal Court placed McClure Carroll, 4556 States street, on probation for one year after he had pleaded guilty to robbing his brother-in-law, Peyton Hill, 1229 Larrabee street, of \$120 worth of clothes on May 6 last. Carroll is to reimburse Mr. Hill for his loss.
