CITY DEPOSITS MONEY IN DOUGLASS NATIONAL BANK

The Douglass National bank of Chicago has been designated as a depository for funds of the city of Chicago. Upon the recommendation of the city comptroller, Hon. George F. Harding, and approved by unanimous vote of the city council, an initial deposit of \$30,000 has been made.

The bank begins the new year under favorable conditions, and at the election held Tuesday at the bank the following officers and board of directors were selected for the ensuing year: Anthony Overton, president; Maj. R. R. Jackson, vice-president; board of directors, S. A. T. Watkins, chairman; Maj. R. R. Jackson, Rev. J. W. Robinson, Edward S. Miller, George Rambo, George T. Kersey, Julian H. Lewis, Thomas H.
