Judge Leo C. Brady of the fifty-sixth district court, who has been ill and out of the city for the past several weeks, was on the bench yesterday, handling three cases.

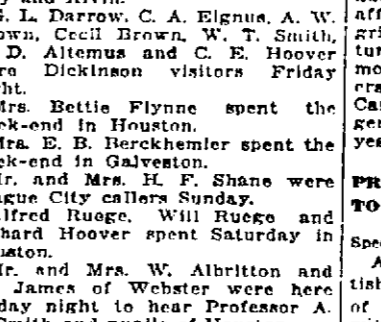
SOUTHERN PACIFIC TO GIVE CELLULOID VALISE TAGS

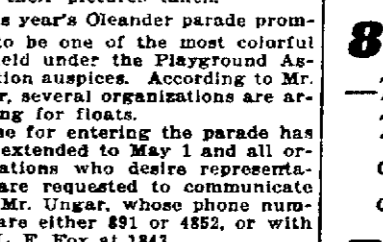
